Tomorrow our senior school sports begin at Rolleston. These events are run by Selwyn sports activators. A huge variety of options are on offer for our students to try with the emphasis on learning the skills of a sport they might not have played before. As a result, we have students in AFL, hockey, netball, skate-boarding, dance, basketball, korfball, squash, badminton, marching, rugby league, rugby, bowls, ultimate frisbee and cricket. Wow, I wish they had that kind of selection when I was at school!!

The students will spend the first three weeks on their chosen sport and then switch to another sport for the last three weeks of term. Because of the logistics of changing after three weeks and the fact that there are so many different sports available, sports uniform will only be issued to the students involved in outdoor sports that require a change of clothes i.e - AFL, rugby, rugby league. All other students will wear school uniform please make sure they have warm layers, eg poly props, school t-shirts, polar fleeces. A light jacket is also recommended.

Rugby/Rugby League- Students involved in these sports will need to have mouth guards if they wish to take part. Hockey- Shin guards and mouth guards are required. Football- Shin guards if you have them but not essential. All other equipment is provided by sports-hockey sticks/skateboards/ball etc. If students wish to bring their own gear this needs to be named and will be their responsibility.

Mana Ake

Recently, the government agreed to continue Mana Ake in Canterbury and expand it to 5 more District Health Board regions.

Mana Ake - Stronger for Tomorrow - supports children aged 5 to 12 who are experiencing circumstances that impact on their wellbeing or mental health. The Mana Ake team works alongside schools and whānau when they have noticed a concern about a child's wellbeing or mental health.

You can talk to your child's teacher, or a member of the school staff, to check if Mana Ake is the right service to support your child. Mana Ake kaimahi (workers) can help children learn skills such as coping with change or challenges, managing their emotions, building positive relationships or overcoming grief and loss. They:

• support teachers to deliver classroom programmes that promote

wellbeing

- work with children and their whānau at home and/or at school
- connect schools and whānau to community resources that enhance wellbeing.

Mana Ake are offering a drop-in service here at school on 14th June 1.30 - 3.30 - this is a one to one meeting with a counsellor for advice and resources around any mental health or well-being questions you have about your child. You can just drop in or make a specific time within that timeframe to meet by contacting the office.

Alternatively, you could book a 20 minute zoom conversation, we can arrange this for you.

Wednesday 2 June, 7.00pm - 8.00pm Tuesday 8 June, 11.30am - 12.30pm


